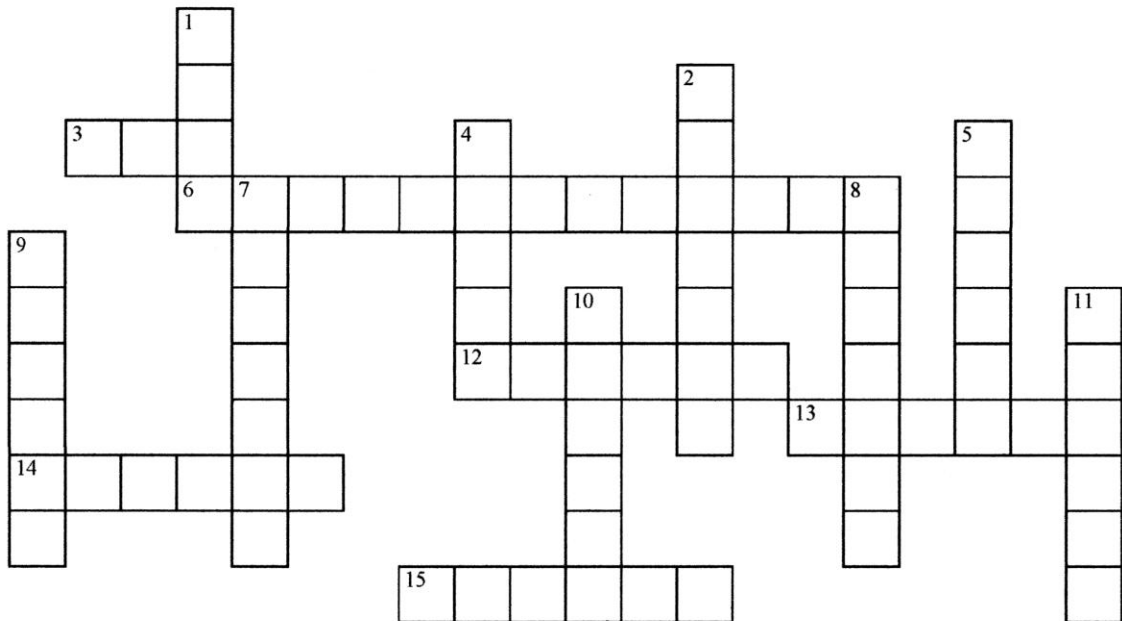


Famous Names in Birmingham History



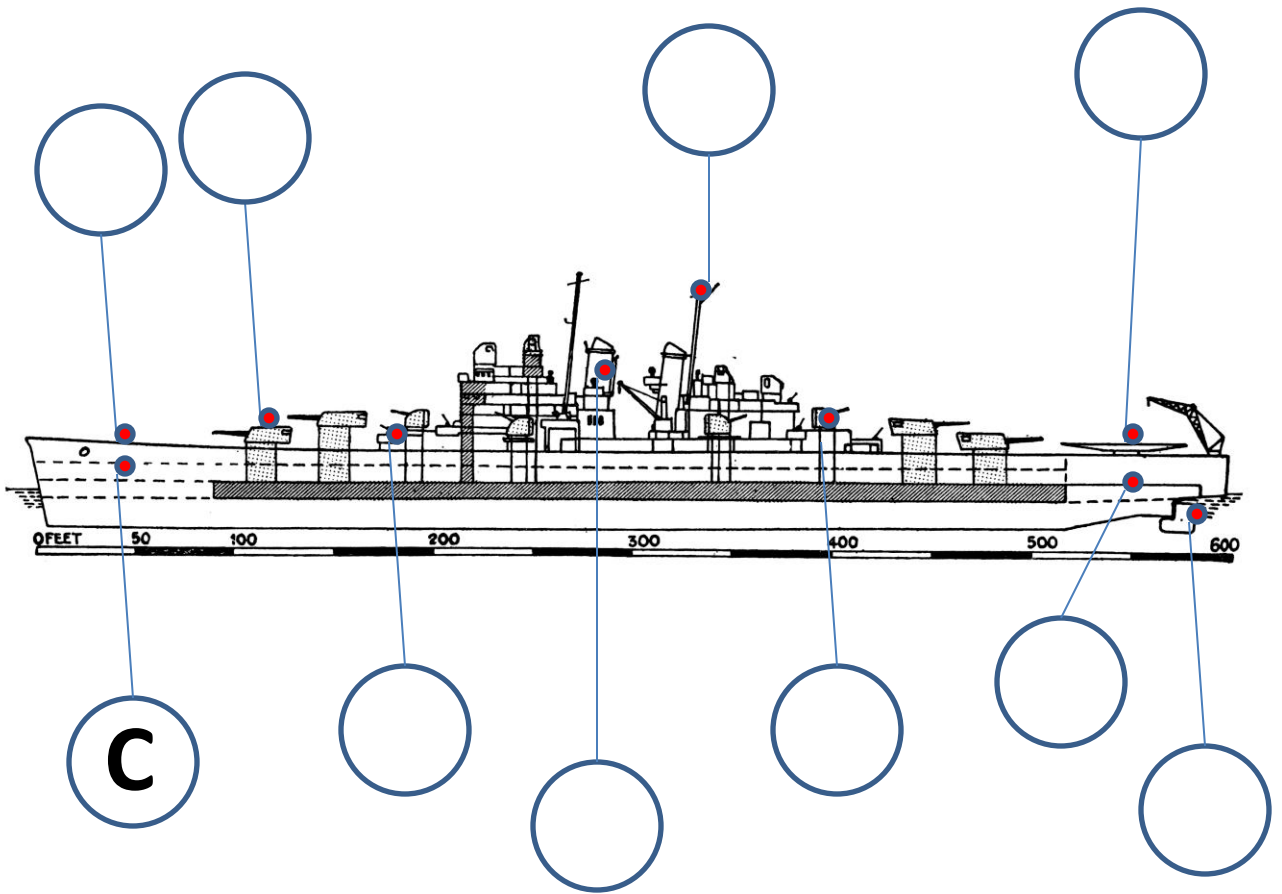
